# 6. Governance, Leadership and Management

#### 6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

#### Mission and Vision

Initially started with a single missionary zeal of providing scope for higher education to the economically weaker section of eligible youths of Jalah tribal belt and block, this College has made periodic review of the institutional goals to slowly come to terms with the global need of higher education. The missions of the College and its visions for the future are reflected in the following aims and objectives such as:

- To cater for the need of higher education to the eligible youths of this unserved region especially the economically and educationally weaker sections of SC/ST and OBC communities.
- To cater accessibility of rural women to higher education.

#### Analysis of feedback of Students-2013-14

Feedbacks from various stakeholders have been periodically received by the Departments and these are analyzed for improvement in quality of teachers and infrastructure in the college. Following is the brief outcome of the feedback from students, alumni, and parents:

- There is a demand by some students for extra classes for weaker section of the students. The College administration has already initiated procedural formalities in this regard.
- There was another demand by the college students union to change the College Uniform. Accordingly the college uniform is changed from the current session.
