#### 1. Title of the Practice

#### POPULARISATION OF HISTORY AS MAJOR SUBJECT

#### 2. Goal

This practice aims at increasing the enrolment of students in the UG Major Classes.

#### 3. The Context

The enrollment in the department of History became almost nil during the last few years. Somehow, the department was surviving with very small number of students. There were certain factors behind the same. As the subject is not taught in the curriculum of Secondary School, nominal number of student study History in 10+2 level, but opting for the subject in 10+2 level was thought necessary to study in under graduate level, hence the History Department did not receive good number of students.

#### 4. Practice

This year, Department of History of the College, gives provision students to opt for History as Major subject in B.A Class, even if History Subject is not studied by students in 10+2 level. As a result, as many as 20 students enrolled in the department of History and have done well in the Semester examinations.

#### 5. Evidence of Success

The success rate of the practice is very encouraging. A total number of 20 students appeared First and Second Semester examinations and out of them 18 students have successfully passed the examination.

#### 6. Problems Encountered and Resources:

This practice is quite successful. However, there are issues that are to be immediately addressed. There are only two faculties the Department and not sufficient enough to take all the routine classes.

# **Best Practice-2**

#### 1. Title of the Practice

#### **ACADEMIC AUDIT OF THE COLLEGE**

#### 2. Goal

This practice aims at to bring a change in the academic performances of the students by making a deep academic audit in the teaching learning evaluation process undertaken during the previous years.

#### 3. The Context

The prime focus of the College is to facilitate congenial academic atmosphere for catering higher education even from rural backward area. The college has been contributing in this field since inception and providing quality education at graduation level. The result of the College is average though the overall pass percentage is satisfactory. The practice of academic audit has been undertaken to bring a qualitative change in the result of College in future.

#### 4. Practice

The College, beyond Graduation Course, started several other courses like Post Graduation, PGDCA, BCA, CCA and D.El ED under KKHSOU to provide more opportunities to the students of this area. In all these courses academic audit was felt necessary and ultimately it was conducted by IQAC of the College.

#### 5. Evidence of Success

The Practice proved successful as the whole evaluation process of all the related courses has minutely been discussed. Short falls were found out and measures have been taken for future positive change in the academic atmosphere of the College.

#### 6. Problems Encountered and Resources:

This practice is quite successful. However, there are issues that are to be immediately addressed. The major cause for poor qualitative result is that most of the marginal students who have somehow pass the HSLC and HS examinations come to this college. The good students usually go to the colleges in urban area. Financially sound parents also send their children to the Urban Colleges, only the poor family background, female students come to this College.
