PROFILE

Bagadhar Brahma Kishan College, Jalah was established on the 16th day of August, 1978 with the relentless and untiring efforts of a band of social workers to push forward the intellectual energy of the people of greater Jalah area towards a blueprint for the future. Initially started with the financial and physical support of the 'people of the region the co-educational institution of higher education was subsequently taken over by the Govt. of Assam under 'deficit-grant-in-aid' system in 1986. It has also been accorded permanent affiliation by Gauhati University and recognised by UGC under 2(f) section 12(B) of UGC act in 1990. Presently, the college is having affiliation from both Gauhati University & Bodoland University The academic excellence and efforts of the college had already been assessed by the NAAC (2nd cycle) and was accredited Grade 'C' in 2020.

The college is located at Jalah under the Jalah Development Block in Chapaguri Mouza of Baksa District, BTR, Assam. It owns vast and sprawling campus amidst an enthralling and serene ambience. The meditative Himalayas in the Northern horizon overlooks the college while Sankardev Sishu Bidya Niketon and a Srimat Bhagabat Mandir in front of the college decorate the spiritual atmosphere of the college. The river Kaldia murmurs majestically encircling northern, southern and western sides. The back of the college is surrounded by lush green plantation, hostels and has a large playground which caters to the need of the lovers of games and sports.

The college is the only recognised Institution of higher education in the Northern most region of Baksa District (BTR), and imparts teaching in Higher Secondary (+2 stage) as well as in Degree (semester system) in Arts stream only. Braving social unrest, paucity of funds, lack of basic infrastructure and academic freedom, this institution has made out an identity of its own by sensitizing itself to new modes of teaching learning experience, continuous academic progress and greater community participation. At present the college has ten teaching Departments at H.S. & BA (T.D.C.) levels and PG level in Assamese, Philosophy with a healthy 40:1 learner teacher ratio.

MISSION AND VISSION OF THE COLLEGE

Initially started with a single missionary zeal of providing scope for higher education to the economically weaker section of eligible youths of Bhebla tribal belt and block (Jalah), and the College has made periodic review of the institutional goals to slowly come to terms with the global need of higher education. The missions of the College and its visions for the future are reflected in the following aims and objectives such as :

- (a) To cater for the need of higher education to the eligible youths of this unserved region especially the economically and educationally weaker section of SC/ST and OBC communities.
- (b) To cater accessibility of rural women to higher education.
- (c) To work continuously to improve upon the quality of general education of this backward region through networking and promotion of intellectual exchange.
- (d) To bring about new concepts and experiments to make teaching-learning experience more satisfying.
- (e) To introduce innovative changes in the Internal Examination as well as the student monitoring mechanism.
- (f) To re-affirm the institution's responsiveness to community needs and re-attest its commitment to social accountability.
- (g) To orient the student community to serve the society by undertaking extension and awareness programmes; and to make such extension activities part of our greater educational experience to help, serve, reflect and learn.
- (h) To make special efforts towards student counselling by imparting training in games and sports, music and fine arts, computer and other career oriented programmes.
- (i) To take a pro-active role in promulgating the spirit of democracy and harmony, peace and progress, mutual help and trust among various multi-ethnic, multi-lingual communities of this region.
- (j) To build up this institution into an advance centre for learning and research.

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COURSE OF STUDY : HIGHER SECONDARY COURSE

Higher Secondary course shall consist of two parts : H.S. 1st year and H.S. 2nd year.

The college offers the privilege of imparting studies in the faculty of Arts only under the aegis of Assam Higher Secondary Education Council. A student who passed H.S.L.C. or equivalent Examination may be admitted to H.S. 1st year and shall have to offer four optional subjects, out of which one automatically becomes the fourth subject in which he/she secures least marks.

Compulsory Subject: 1. English 2. MIL (Assamese, Bodo, Alternative English)

Optional Subject : 1. Economics 2. Political Science 3. Education 4. Logic & Philosophy

5. Advance Assamese, Advance Bodo, or Sanskrit (classics) or Mathematics 6. History or Statistics

New academic session begins in the month of August of every year. Admission procedure, however, begins during the month of June of every year. Interested students can take admission through online and admission form can be downloaded from the college website-www.bbkishancollege.ac.in. There will be no hard copy of prospectus & the same can be downloaded from the college website. Students will have to clearly indicate their subject combination in the specified column of the application form at the time of submission. Classes of H.S. II year, B.A. 3rd Semester and B.A. Fifth Semester begin as per B. U. Academic Calender and admission to those classes will be maintained as per AHSEC and B. U. notification.

PROCEDURE FOR INTERNAL EVALUATION

1. The allotted marks for internal evaluation is 20 % in each paper and is based on the following structure:

- Sessional examination-1 (10 %)
- seminar/workshop/library visit etc (10%)

2. Each sessional examination is of one hour of duration and is conducted by the concerned departments. The setting of question paper, invigilator duty, evaluation of answer script for each paper is to be done by the concerned departments.

3. The college authority/AAC notifies the date of sessional examination in each paper following the guidelines of academic schedule of the university and answer scripts are supplied by the university.

4. Each student is assessed every week with different academic activities such as lecture, group discussion, home assignment, seminar etc. for such credit point is awarded to the students for each paper and grading system is based as

PROCEDURE FOR EXTERNAL EVALUATION

1. The University authority notifies the dates of final examination of each semester in due time.

2. Each paper carries 80 % of the total marks for external evaluation.

3. The pass percentage in each paper is 40 (Both Internal & External)

4. A student must complete his/her degree within five academic years from the date of admission.



RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. No student shall be admitted to any course of studies if he/she is found to have indulged in activities detrimental to academic interest.
2. A student who is found to have violated college rules shall be liable to expulsion.
3. A student who is found to have indulged in consumption of drugs or intoxicating drinks, gambling or other Immoral activities shall be liable to expulsion.
4. Each academic session runs as per Academic Calender.
5. Classes commence on the date to be notified after admission.
6. Student admitted to various course of studies are required to participate in lectures, group discussions, tutorials, seminars and other academic activities as prescribed and shall be expected to participate in the co- curricular and extra-curricular activities organised by the college. They are required to participate in the evaluation process as prescribed by the Authority. Students who fail to do so without assigning sufficient reasons to the satisfaction of the competent authority shall not be permitted to continue their studies.
7. A student failing to attend classes for 30 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes shall forfeit his/her seat if he/she fails to provide satisfactory reasons.
8. Students failing to attend at least 75% of total classes in a session will not be qualified for scholarship/ promotion.
9. In case of loss of Identity Card / Library Card, students are to immediately report to the college authority and get duplicate card(s) on payment for prescribed fees.
10. Students are expected to use College property with utmost care and help to keep the college campus neat and tidy.
11. The decision of the Executive Body (Governing Body) on all matters relating to students' indiscipline shall be final and binding.
12. Mobile phones inside the classroom and examination hall are strictly prohibited.
13. Wearing of the college uniform is compulsory during college hours on all occasions.
14. Ragging is strictly prohibited and its violation leads severe punishment.

5. GYMNASIUM CUM HEALTH CLUB :

Since inception it has been the philosophy of the college to extend as many as facilities possible for the all round development of students and the local youths and accordingly, the college inaugurated a gymnasium cum health club on 21 st March, 2007 which was donated by the Indian Army, Red Horn Division, Rangia. The Gym. functions in open access to its members who register their names and is maintained by the student union body of the college.

6. INDOOR STADIUM :

The college completed the construction of Indoor stadium in the year 2019 which was financially aided by the UGC, NER. The Indoor Stadium provides large scope to each student to engage in various games & sports events like badminton, volley ball, kawadi, carrom and many others.

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ATTENDANCE :

Attendance in classes is obligatory. All regular students must have at least 75% attendance of the total number of lectures for theoretical classes to become eligible for applying scholarship and to sit for the final examination. Wilful absence may lead to the discontinuation of their study.

LIBRARY :

The College Library has a good collection of textbooks, general books, rare books, journals, periodicals and newspapers. It is catering to the need of about 1000 readers consisting of teachers, students, employees and others. The Library of college, though not very large, is better organised. It has one students reading room and one teachers reading room. The number of books and Journals at present in the Library is around 20889.

The Library functions in cataloguing and close access system from 9 A.M. to 5 P.M. on all working days. Computer has already been installed and computerisation of the reading materials has been under process. Xerox facility is also available in the Library for the visitors.

A Non-transferable library Identity Card is issued to each student along with College Identity Card at the time of admission. In case of loss of the card, students are advised to immediately report to the Librarian and get a duplicate one. Any breach of library rules is punishable offence. It may lead to heavy fine or cancellation of Library Identity Card.

GIRLS HOSTEL :

The College has a girls' hostel named BIRGWSHREE GIRLS HOSTEL, which accommodates 32 girl students. Selection for hostel admission is made on the basis of academic records and the distance from their residence. A boarder who is found to have violated Hostel Rules is liable to expulsion from the hostel as well as from the College. Students selected for a seat in hostel will have to pay Hostel Admission Fees separately.

BOYS HOSTEL :

The college also provides accommodation to the boys students in its BOYS HOSTEL with a boarding capacity of fifteen students. Selection for hostel admission is made on the basis of academic records and the distance from their residence. A boarder who is found to have violated Hostel Rules is liable to expulsion from the hostel as well as from the College. Students selected for a seat in hostel will have to pay Hostel Admission Fees separately.

B.B. KISHAN COLLEGE STUDENTS UNION, JALAH (BBKCSU)

To look into the well-being of students of B.B. Kishan College, a Students Union Body (BBKCSU) is elected every year in accordance with the guidelines of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 22-09-2006. The guidelines are as follows-

1. Under graduate students between the age of 17 and 22 only can contest the election.
2. Although, the committee would refrain from prescribing any particular minimum marks to be attained by a candidate, the candidate should in no case have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election.
3. The candidate should have the minimum percentage of attendance in classes as Prescribed by the University or 75% attendance, whichever is higher.
4. The candidate shall have one opportunity to contest for the post of office bearer.
5. The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record that is to say he/she should not have been tried and or convicted of any offence or misdemeanor. The candidate shall also not have been subject to any disciplinary action by the college authorities.
6. The candidate must be a regular full time student of the college.

KEY POINTS OF SEMESTER SYSTEM

1. A student will get maximum three chances to clear a particular semester. The chances means three continuous examinations of a particular semester irrespective of a student appears or not. For example, a student of 2014 batch will get three chances i.e.- in 2014, 2015 and 2016, thus, a student shall have to complete his/her all papers of all semester examination in 2016.
2. Students can apply for repeat examinations in one of the theory papers in 1st, 2nd and 3rd semester examinations. The provision for repeat examination is not applicable for 4th, 5th and 6th semester examinations.
3. Re-evaluation of answer scripts should be addressed to the Deputy Controller of Examination, through the Principal within 15 days from the date of declaration of results of the respective examination.
4. It is mandatory for all students to appear in sessional examinations. The minimum marks for passing in each paper is 40 % of the total marks.
5. Subject correction and switch over cases from Honours to Regular Course is allowed in 1st semester only.
6. Application form for name correction, withheld result clearance, subject correction, duplicate marksheet, admit card, re-evaluation of answer scripts etc may be downloaded from the GU website: www.gauhati.ac.in and in case of BU, www.bodolanduniversity.ac.in and be submitted to the principal along with the necessary documents and fees.
