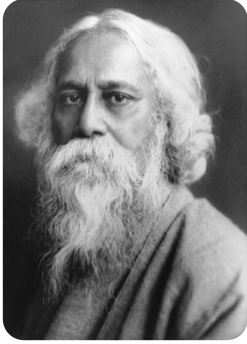

a mark of respect to both.

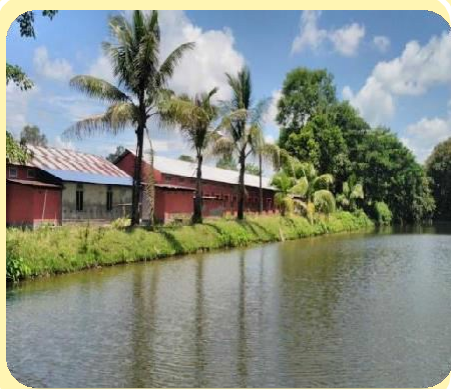
## Mission and Vision

- (d) Introduce new concepts and experimental approaches to enrich the teaching-learning experience.
- (e) Implement innovative changes in the internal examination processes and student monitoring mechanisms.
- (f) Reaffirm the institution's responsiveness to community needs and reinforce its commitment to social accountability.
- (g) Encourage the student community to engage with society through extension and awareness programs, integrating these activities into a broader educational experience that fosters helping, serving, reflecting, and learning.
- (h) Make concerted efforts toward student counseling by providing training in sports, music and fine arts, computer skills, and other career-oriented programs.
- (i) Actively promote the spirit of democracy, harmony, peace, progress, mutual assistance, and trust among the diverse multi-ethnic and multi-lingual communities in this region.
- (j) Build this institution into an advanced center for learning and research.

# COLLEGE PROFILE



Bagadhar Brahma Kishan College, Jalah, was established on 16 August 1978 through the dedicated efforts of a group of committed social workers with the vision of advancing higher education in the greater Jalah region. Initially sustained by the financial and physical support of the local community, the co-educational institution was brought under the Government of Assam in 1986 through the deficit grant-in-aid system. The college received permanent affiliation from Gauhati University and was recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) under Sections 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act in 1990. Subsequently, it became affiliated with Bodoland University, Kokrajhar. The institution has undergone assessment by NAAC and was accredited with Grade 'B' in 2005 and Grade 'C' in 2020.

Located at Jalah in the Jalah Development Block of Chapaguri Mouza, Baksa District (BTR), Assam, the college is set amidst a serene and picturesque environment. The distant Himalayan foothills to the north, nearby educational and religious institutions, and the gently flowing Kaldia River surrounding three sides of the campus create a tranquil academic atmosphere. The campus includes hostels, staff quarters, green plantations, and a playground catering to sports and extracurricular activities.

As the only recognized institution of higher education in the northernmost part of the Baksa district, the college offers higher secondary (arts and science), four-year undergraduate programs (FYUGP) in arts and science, and postgraduate courses in Assamese and philosophy under Bodoland University. Despite challenges such as social unrest, limited resources, and infrastructural constraints, the college has established a distinct identity through its commitment to quality education, innovative teaching-learning practices, continuous academic development, and community engagement. At present, the college has fifteen teaching departments at the undergraduate level and maintains a healthy teacher–student ratio of approximately 1:18.

## FROM PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Bagadhar Brahma Kishan College, Jalah, originally known as Kishan College, was established on the 16th day of August, 1978, at Jalahghat of the then greater Kamrup district, now included in the Baksa district of BTR, Assam. However, after a few years, the college was renamed with public consensus as Bagadhar Brahma Kishan College, paying a deep obeisance to the late Bagadhar Brahma, a dedicated farmer and a humble social worker. Established with the unconceited zest for imparting higher education to the eligible youths of the locality, B. B. ## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. No student shall be admitted to any course of studies if he/she is found to have indulged in activities detrimental to academic interest.

A student found to have violated college rules shall be liable to expulsion.

3. A student who is found to have indulged in the consumption of drugs or intoxicating drinks, gambling, or other immoral activities shall be liable to expulsion.

Each academic session runs as per the academic calendar.

Classes commence on the date to be notified after admission.

6. Students admitted to various courses of studies are required to participate in lectures, group discussions, tutorials, seminars, and other academic activities as prescribed and shall be expected to participate in the co-curricular and extra-curricular activities organized by the college. They are required to participate in the evaluation process as prescribed by the authority. Students who fail to do so without assigning sufficient reasons to the satisfaction of the competent authority shall not be permitted to continue their studies.

7. A student failing to attend classes for 15 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes shall forfeit his/her seat if he/she fails to provide satisfactory reasons.

8. Students failing to attend at least 75% of total classes in a session will not be qualified for scholarship/promotion.

9. In case of loss of identity card/library card, students are to immediately report to the college authority and get duplicate card(s) on payment for prescribed fees.

10. Students are expected to use college property with utmost care and help to keep the college campus neat and tidy.

11. The decision of the executive body (governing body) on all matters relating to students' indiscipline shall be final and binding.

12. Mobile phones inside the classroom and examination hall are strictly prohibited.

## ELEGIBILITY NORMS

For B.A. & B.Sc. courses: passed the H.S. or equivalent examination with at least 40% marks. For HS Course: HSLC passed with 40 % and for PG Course: graduation in concerned subjects with honors.

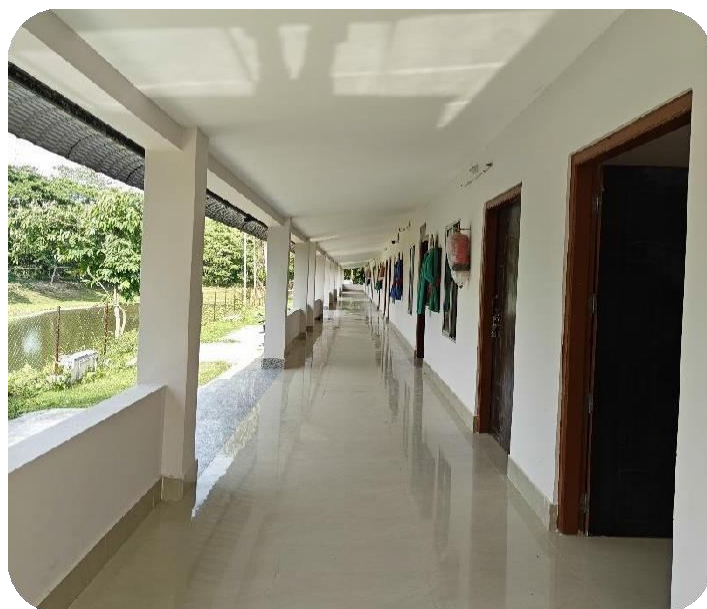

## 5. DIGITAL LIBRARY

The college library has recently been upgraded to digital form. The library has a wonderful collection of textbooks, general books, rare books, journals, periodicals, and newspapers. It is catering to the needs of about 1000 readers, consisting of teachers, students, employees, and others. Despite its small size, the college library is well-organized. It has one student reading room and one teacher reading room. The number of textbooks in the library is more than 20,000. There are two print journals, five e-journals, and 1000 e-books available in the library. The library has a collection of 10 numbers of these.

The library functions in a cataloging and close access system from 9 A.M. to 5 P.M. on all working days. The computer has already been installed; the computerization of the reading materials is under process; and FIRD has been installed in the Central Library. The Xerox facility is also available in the library for the visitors.

A non-transferable digital library identity card is issued to each student along with the college identity card at the time of admission. In case of loss of the card, students are advised to immediately report to the librarian and obtain a duplicate one. Any breach of library rules is a punishable offense. It may lead to a heavy fine or cancellation of the library identity card.
